FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. Over sixty percent of the Mississippi high school graduates who attend college do so at the community colleges. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the recommended course of study. Studies reveal that community college transfer students perform at a par with the native student at four-year institutions.

Community colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary occupational programs in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the schools. Community colleges also provide a variety of continuing education, community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility to respond to needs of a given segment of the state's society. This sensitivity is the result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Community and Junior College Association, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, approves vocational and technical programs and attendance centers, assembles reports, and provides general coordination. The State Board of Education (K-12) serves as the State Board for Vocational Education, and through its Bureau of Vocational and Technical Education administers programs on the secondary and post-secondary level.

REASON FOR EXCEEDING MAXIMUM MILLIAGE AS SPECIFIED IN SECTION 37-29-141:

EAST CENTRAL - E&I at East Central CC includes a Special Tax Levy for Barber Hall from Leake Co. of \$55,000, Neshoba of \$88,198 or 0.6 mills, Newton of \$40,800, Scott of \$51,830 or 0.5 mills, and Winston of \$32,083.

EAST MISSISSIPPI - Lauderdale County is providing a special levy of \$50,000 for construction to EMCC.

ITAWAMBA - Maintenance at Itawamba CC includes extra millage per Section 37-35-3 for the establishment and maintenance of adult education classes in the amount of 0.20 or \$19,344 and \$29,941 from Itawamba and Pontotoc, respectively, 0.08 or \$53,466 from Lee and 0.13 or \$29,916 from Monroe counties. Under E&I, Itawamba County has added 1.0 extra mill or \$96,833 and Lee County 0.31 mills or \$193,191 per Section 27-39-329 for debt service.

MERIDIAN - Maintenance at Meridian CC includes extra millage per Section 37-35-3 for the establishment and maintenance of adult education classes in the amount of 1.0 mill or \$237,358.

MISS. GULF COAST - Section 37-29-437 allows MGCCC additional millage: George Co. levied 0.32 mills or \$50,000 for a Training Facility Loan (E&I).

NORTHEAST - E&I for Prentiss County in the Northeast CC district consists of the following levies: 1.00 or \$82,483 under Section 37-29-267 for land and building purchase, and 0.75 or \$61,862 under Section 27-39-329 for debt service.

NORTHWEST - Northwest MS CC received a levy of 1.60 or \$412,410 for debt service from Lafayette Co.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. Over sixty percent of the Mississippi high school graduates who attend college do so at the community colleges. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the recommended course of study. Studies reveal that community college transfer students perform at a par with the native student at four-year institutions.

Community colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary occupational programs in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the schools. Community colleges also provide a variety of continuing education, community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility to respond to needs of a given segment of the state's society. This sensitivity is the result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Community and Junior College Association, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, approves vocational and technical programs and attendance centers, assembles reports, and provides general coordination. The State Board of Education (K-12) serves as the State Board for Vocational Education, and through its Bureau of Vocational and Technical Education administers programs on the secondary and post-secondary level.

EAST CENTRAL - E&I at East Central CC includes a Special Tax Levy for Barber Hall from Leake Co. of \$55,000 or .65 mills, Neshoba of \$70,680 or 0.6 mills, Newton of \$40,800 or 0.6 mills, Scott of \$50,014 or 0.45 mills, and Winston of \$35,000.

EAST MISSISSIPPI - Lauderdale County is providing a special levy of \$50,000 for construction to EMCC.

ITAWAMBA - Maintenance at Itawamba CC includes extra millage per Section 37-35-3 for the establishment and maintenance of adult education classes in the amount of 0.20 or \$20,084 and \$25,463 from Itawamba and Pontotoc, respectively, 0.08 or \$66,413 from Lee and 0.13 or \$30,085 from Monroe counties. Under E&I, Itawamba Co. has added 1.0 extra mill or \$100,420 and Lee Co. 0.31 mills or \$200,083, per S. 37-39-329 for debt service.

MERIDIAN - Maintenance at Meridian CC includes extra millage per Section 37-35-3 for the establishment and maintenance of adult education classes in the amount of 1.0 mill or \$248,294.

MISS. GULF COAST - Section 37-29-437 allows MGCCC additional millage; George Co. levied \$50,000 for a Training Facility Loan (E&I).

NORTHEAST - E&I for Prentiss County in the Northeast CC district consists of the following levies: 1.00 or \$82,483 under Section 37-29-267 for land and building purchase, and 0.75 or \$61,862 under S. 27-39-329 for debt service.

NORTHWEST - Northwest MS CC received a levy of 1.60 or \$424,711 for debt service from Lafayette Co.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. Over seventy percent of all freshmen enrolled in Mississippi's post-secondary institutions (both public and private) are enrolled in Mississippi's public community and junior colleges. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the recommended course of study. Studies reveal that community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary occupational programs and workforce education in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the schools. Community colleges also provide a variety of continuing education, community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility to respond to needs of a given segment of the state's society. This sensitivity is the result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Community and Junior College Association, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, approves vocational and technical programs and attendance centers, assembles reports, and provides general coordination.

EAST CENTRAL - E&I at East Central CC includes a Special Tax Levy for a Girls' Dorm Building Fund from Leake Co. of \$55,000 or .65 mills, Neshoba of \$73,996 or 0.6 mills, Newton of \$84,871 or 0.6 mills, Scott of \$81,892 or 0.45 mills and Winston of \$35,000.

EAST MISSISSIPPI - Lauderdale County is providing a special levy of \$50,000 for construction to EMCC.

ITAWAMBA - Maintenance at Itawamba CC includes extra millage per Section 37-35-3 for the establishment and maintenance of adult education classes in the amount of 0.20 or \$20,084 and \$27,304 from Itawamba and Pontotoc, respectively, 0.07 or \$51,500 from Lee and 0.12 or \$29,615 from Monroe counties. FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the recommended course of study. Studies reveal that community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary occupational programs and workforce education in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the schools. Community colleges also provide a variety of continuing education, community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility to respond to needs of a given segment of the state's society. This sensitivity is the result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Community and Junior College Association, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, approves vocational and technical programs and attendance centers, assembles reports, and provides general coordination.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the recommended course of study. Studies reveal that community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary occupational programs and workforce education in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the schools. Community colleges also provide a variety of continuing education, community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility to respond to needs of a given segment of the state's society. This sensitivity is the result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Community and Junior College Association, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, approves vocational and technical programs and attendance centers, assembles reports, and provides general coordination.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment and civil rights compliance, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, manages the Mississippi Virtual Community College, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment and civil rights compliance, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, manages the Mississippi Virtual Community College, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment and civil rights compliance, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, manages the Mississippi Virtual Community College, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi Community College Board. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the Mississippi Community College Board (formerly the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges), which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi Community College Board. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the Mississippi Community College Board (formerly the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges), which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi Community College Board. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the Mississippi Community College Board (formerly the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges), which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi Community College Board. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the Mississippi Community College Board (formerly the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges), which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi Community College Board. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the Mississippi Community College Board (formerly the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges), which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi Community College Board. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the Mississippi Community College Board (formerly the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges), which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.

FOREWORD

As the first state to establish a system of public community colleges, the state has fifteen comprehensive community college districts which provide educational programs and services that are accessible to virtually all Mississippi citizens. This has been a goal of these two-year institutions since the first one began admitting students in 1922. All public community colleges are accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Mississippi Commission on College Accreditation.

This network of institutions operates both university transfer and occupationally-oriented programs. A student may transfer earned credits to four-year institutions without loss of credit if the student has followed the Articulation Agreement between the MS Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the Mississippi Community College Board. Studies reveal that Mississippi community college transfer students perform as well or better than the native students at Mississippi's public four-year institutions.

Community and junior colleges are the primary delivery mechanism for post-secondary career and technical education programs and workforce training in Mississippi. These programs of two-years or less duration are designed to prepare students for immediate employment and for upgrading skills of those currently employed. Training programs in more than one hundred occupational skills are provided by the colleges. They also provide a variety of continuing education, as well as community and public service activities. The institutions are funded by state appropriations, local district taxes, student tuition and fees and federal grants.

A characteristic of Mississippi's community colleges is their flexibility and rapid response to the changing needs of their service districts. This is a direct result of an administration and a board of control operating at the local level. Each college district has a local governing board which employs the president and faculty, owns property, establishes budgets for operation and capital improvement, and sets policies for the general governance of the institution. Cooperation by the various institutions on state-wide endeavors is accomplished through the Mississippi Association for Community and Junior Colleges, a voluntary organization of the institutions represented by their presidents.

State coordination and oversight is provided by the Mississippi Community College Board (formerly the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges), which on July 1, 1986, was named successor to the Junior College Commission. With regard to the system of community colleges, the State Board establishes standards for operation, administers state appropriations, audits enrollment, approves career and technical education programs, accredits schools of practical nursing, approves campuses, centers, and sites, assembles reports, and provides general coordination, support, leadership and advocacy.
